Our Sustainability Team attended the Sustainable Palm Oil Dialogue (SPOD) 2024 Europe held in Belgium between May 21st and 23rd, 2024. Our team members had the opportunity to meet with colleagues and stakeholders during the visit and share ideas and progress in our plantation.

Under the theme, "Inclusive Pathways for Climate-smart Solutions," the dialogue featured prominent speakers who discussed multifaceted approaches for voluntary and mandatory initiatives to combat climate change and enhance the sector's overall positive impact. A much anticipated discussion was the **European Union Deforestation** Regulation (EUDR) shed light on the decades of work by the private sector that has set a foundation for legislation to build upon. The main objective looked at how innovative initiatives can support emissions' reduction, deforestation, supply chain traceability, and satellite monitoring, some of the practical elements of what the European Commission intends to achieve with the EUDR. In this regards, we will continue to strengthen our commitment with:
